DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What is the strangest law you have ever heard of? Here are a few of my favorites:
 - a. In Milan, Italy, it is illegal for citizens to frown in public unless at a funeral or visiting someone in the hospital.
 - b. In Singapore, it is illegal to sell or even chew gum.
 - c. In Mexico, it is illegal for bicyclists to lift their feet off the pedals while riding.
 - d. In New Zealand, you cannot fly in a hot air balloon with a rooster.
- 2. How do you feel about following these Old Covenant laws?
 - a. Men must not shave the hair off the sides of their head Lev. 19:27
 - b. Do not tattoo the skin Lev. 19:28
 - c. Do not walk outside the city boundary on Shabbat Ex. 16:29
 - d. Do not eat or drink on Yom Kippur Lev. 23:29
 - e. Do not wear cloth made with two kinds of fabric Deut. 22:11
 - f. Do not eat pork Lev. 11:7
 - g. Do not eat shrimp, lobster, clams, oysters, scallops, crabs, or any seafood that doesn't have fins and scales Lev. 11:11
