- 4. Paul gave several principles for working as a Christian which are summarized here:
 - a. Work hard at whatever you do.
 - b. Do what you say you will do.
 - c. Follow authority unless it violates a higher authority.
 - d. Work as an act of worship.
 - e. If you do wrong, God will allow you to face the consequences.
 - f. Bosses and supervisors must be fair and just to those who work for them.
