Read Matthew 21:23-32. You should also scan the preceding verses to catch the context of this parable.

- 3. Why was the question of what authority Jesus had such a big deal to the chief priests and elders?
- 4. What was the significance of John the Baptizer's ministry and why did Jesus use that as the response to the religious leaders?
- 5. In the parable (v. 28-29) Jesus tells his listeners about two sons. How do their responses to the father illustrate how people respond to God?
- 6. What lessons should we draw from Jesus' statement in verse 31 that "corrupt tax collectors and prostitutes will get into the kingdom of God before you do."?
- 7. What lessons should we draw from the religious leaders' refusal to acknowledge the unfolding of God's redemptive plan?
- 8. Is God calling you to action in an area of service or deeper obedience to Him? If so, what is that call and will you follow today?
