



Making Wise Choices in Foggy Conditions (Part 2)

1. In verse 6, we read that the Holy Spirit prevented Paul and his companions from preaching the word in Asia. Have you ever experienced a situation where you felt led to do something, but circumstances prevented you from doing it? How did you respond to that situation?
2. Paul receives a vision in verse 9, where a man from Macedonia pleads for help. Why do you think Paul and his companions were specifically called to Macedonia? What lessons can we learn from this about being open to God's leading and guidance in our own lives?
3. In verse 10, after receiving the vision, Paul and his companions immediately set out for Macedonia. How do you think their obedience to God's direction played a role in the spread of the gospel in that region? How can we cultivate a spirit of obedience in our own lives?
4. Reflecting on this passage, what does it teach us about the role of the Holy Spirit in guiding our actions and decisions as Christians? How can we discern the leading of the Holy Spirit in our lives today?
5. Paul and his companions apparently did not feel the need to wait for specific direction from God to take action, though they were willing to be redirected along the way. Can you think of something that you could take action on even if you don't already have clear direction from God?
6. How can taking action that aligns with biblical principles without clear direction from God actually be an act of faith?
