Read Matthew 5:13-16 and Colossians 4:2-6.

1. Jesus calls us the “salt of the earth” and the “light of the world.” What do you think this means in practical terms for our daily lives?
2. In what ways have you seen Christians act as “salt” and “light” in your community?
3. Being salt and light is about who we are, not just what we do. How does this perspective change the way we think about sharing our faith?
4. Paul asks the Colossians to pray for an open door to share the gospel (Colossians 4:3). How can we incorporate prayer into our daily lives to prepare for gospel conversations?
5. How have you seen prayer make a difference in someone coming to faith?
6. The BLESS acronym (Bless, Listen, Eat, Speak, Sabbath/Celebrate) is presented as a framework for gospel-centered relationships. Which of these areas do you find most challenging? Which comes most naturally to you?
7. Have you ever experienced or witnessed evangelism that felt forced or inauthentic? How did it impact you?
8. The concept of a “craft mindset” in evangelism suggests a personal, intentional approach rather than a one-size-fits-all method. What are some ways we can tailor our approach to different people in our lives?
9. Who are the people in your concentric circles (family, friends, neighbors, coworkers, etc.) that you feel called to pray for and influence with the gospel?
