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1. This week, we looked at how “Heaven is Big” and how God is including many people whom the religious elites in Jesus’ time might not have expected.

How does the knowledge that God is inviting all sorts of people, not just those who “have their act together,” impact your perception of His kingdom?

2. The guests in the story didn't give "evil" excuses; they cited work, property, and personal relationships, things that are generally considered good or necessary. How can legitimate, "good" parts of our lives (like our career, our hobbies, or our family dynamics) become distractions that keep us from prioritizing God?
3. Adam mentioned that there are only two kinds of people: those who need God and know it, and those who need God and won't admit it. Why is admitting our need for a Savior so difficult, and how does recognizing our own "brokenness" change the way we view others who are also struggling?
4. Read Ephesians 4:1-6.

How specifically does focusing on the core "ones" help us be united together in peace?

*(You may want to divide the "ones" and come up with a way that prioritizing each "one" can contribute to our unity.)*

5. Who is someone in your life, whether in your neighborhood, workplace, or social circle, that you find it hard to connect with because of your differences? How can you extend the kindness of God's "big table" to them this week?
